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CHAIRMAN'S LETTER By: James S. Anderson, PLS



At the August 14, 2006 meeting, the Board passed a resolution to lower individual renewal fees from \$100.00 to \$30.00 for renewal of its

licenses for the licensing periods beginning January 1, 2007 and concluding December 31, 2008, and beginning January 1, 2008 and concluding December 31, 2009. You may recall the Board experienced financial difficulty which required an increase in renewal rates in 2001. At that time, under Paul Munger's leadership, the Board made many changes to reduce expenses. Since that time, the Board and the staff have continued to seek ways to reduce costs and increase efficiency. Because of their efforts, the Board's financial condition has improved to the point that renewal rates can now be lowered significantly. Although this reduction is temporary, a rule reducing the current \$100.00 rate is likely to occur should the current trend continue. I would like to personally commend all the Board Members and staff, and particularly our Executive Director, Judy Kempker, for making this possible.

Over the past few years, the Board has revised many of the rules regulating our professions. Some changes were minor and necessary to comply with the statute changing our Board from the

Missouri Board for Architects, Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors to the Missouri Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Professional Land Surveyors and Landscape Architects. Some were more significant such as the rules regarding the use of electronic signatures, continuing education, and the rule requiring a managing agent be named to obtain a certificate of authority. Currently, the Board is working to write a rule to create a "Standard of Care" for architecture, engineering, and landscape architecture.

In 2004, the Board voted to promulgate a Standard of Care rule. The rule would be similar to the rule defining Minimum Standards for land surveyors. The Minimum Standards define the minimum amount of work required in performing a survey and the minimum amount of information to be shown on a survey. When a surveying complaint is received, the Board can objectively determine if the survey is in compliance with the Minimum Standards. In addition, land surveyors know what the Board will use as a basis to review their survey if a complaint is filed on their survey.

The 2004 version of the Standard of Care rule said "In the absence of any local building code, all buildings shall be designed in accordance with the most recent applicable codes as published by the International Code Conference." As with the minimum

survey standards, the intent was to inform design professionals what the Board would use as part of the basis for reviewing plans which are the subject of a complaint. The Board received both positive and negative comments on the rule. Most of the negative comments said the rule would create a statewide building code and the Board did not have the authority to publish such a rule. The

Board agreed with the comments and voted to withdraw the rule as published at that time.

The Board did not believe it had the authority to create a statewide building code and that was not the intent of the rule published in 2004. The Board did believe, however, that a Standard of Care rule was an idea worth pursuing. After the 2004 rule was withdrawn, the Board formed a committee to discuss the idea with other interested organizations. At the August 14, 2006 Board meeting, the Board voted to promulgate the rule which was drafted by that committee. A copy of that rule appears in this newsletter on page 24 and will later be published in the Missouri Register. The Board would welcome any comments you may have on this proposed rule.

ARCHITECTURAL DIVISION LETTER

I was a member of the Architectural Review Board in the town of Kirkwood, Missouri for nine years, the last five as Chairman. Kirkwood is a suburb of St. Louis and has the same problems as most suburbs today, declining tax base, aging infrastructure, the building of McMansions replacing solid although basic housing, etc. As we fought the blight of these new monsters the two favorite words of the City Attorney still ring in my ears... "arbitrary" and "capricious." We had statutes for guidelines although vague. These guidelines needed interpretation and we were always looking at precedent setting decisions. Most of the time we were on our own.

Webster's Dictionary defines the word "arbitrary" as "depending on individual discretion (as of a judge) and not fixed by law." It defines the word "capricious" as "governed or characterized by caprice." The word "caprice" in turn is defined as "a sudden impulsive and seemingly unmotivated notion or action."

As Board Chairman Jim Anderson has noted in his front page article, we are now promulgating a Standard of Care rule which I happen to think is one of the most important changes to occur certainly within the three plus years I have been on the Board. As with Jim, I encourage you to read the rule and send us your comments. Hopefully none of you will be facing a situation where this rule will be used

to judge your competency but if you do you can at least know that our decisions are based on an easily understandable rule.

Also at the August meeting the Board voted to promulgate a rule regarding the need for title blocks on drawings. A copy of that rule is also contained in this newsletter and I encourage each of you to read that rule as it also has an impact on your practice. It continually amazes me that many of the documents prepared by our Missouri licensees can be so incomplete as to the information they contain. As noted earlier we are trying to assure that construction documents are more complete and accurate by the Standard of Care rule. This Title Block rule is to assure that basic information such as job title, location, professional's name, etc. are included on the document. Some may say we are trying to micro-manage the system but if you talk to building officials or plan reviewers around the state they will say that this rule is sorely needed.

The final item I want to comment on is not a newly proposed rule but one that is going into full effect on December 31st of this year. That rule has to do with Continuing Education Units (CEU's). I am sure that all of you are aware of the basics of this rule: you must have attained 24 CEU's of which 16 shall be related to Health, Safety and Welfare (HSW) in the last two years to renew your license by December 31st, 2006. We have approximately 4800 architects in the State of Missouri so about 2400 of you will be renewing your license at this time. When you do, as a part of the form you fill out, will be an item where you will have to attest that you have attained the necessary CEU credits in the last twenty-four months. At that point you will not have to furnish any proof but your professional ethics will be on the line when you sign that form. The

Architectural Division will have the computer randomly select a percentage of licensees for audit, at which time it will be the selected licensees' responsibility to provide proof of having obtained the required credits. It is not the responsibility of the provider to keep track of these credits but it is your job as a professional to do that. Although the new rule has a time limit for your attaining the required credits if your audit finds you short, your attesting to items that you knowingly had not obtained can put your license in jeopardy.

As Bob Dylan said many years ago "The Times They Are A-Changing". I think the changes are for the better and benefit the health, safety and welfare of the public which is the bottom line of what we are all about.

PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING DIVISION LETTER

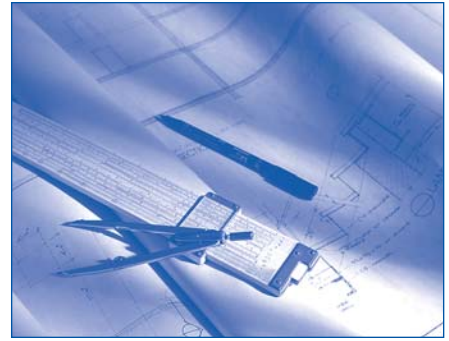

QUESTION:
What do these people have in common?

A drafting technician, a general contractor with an engineering degree, and a graduate of an engineering program with four years of experience in a consulting firm?

ANSWER: None of these persons is authorized to call him/herself an engineer. Neither can that individual provide engineering on a project unless he/she is licensed as a professional engineer by this Board or is working under the immediate personal supervision of a licensed professional engineer. The



contractor and the graduate of the engineering program may have some of the qualifications to do engineering, but unless that person is licensed, he/she is not authorized to do so.

The Board reviews complaints against individuals who call themselves engineers but who are not in fact licensed with this Board. Why does this matter? It matters because some members of the public do not recognize the distinction between someone who has attended engineering school and someone who has completed the requirements for licensure. Those of us who are licensed know that there is a difference.

Imagine that you need the services of an attorney. Would it be good enough for you that the individual just attended law school? What if he called himself an "Attorney" but hadn't passed the bar? How would you know if the individual met all of the requirements that other attorneys in your state require for licensure? Given the choice, you would most likely choose the person who you know meets state qualifications. Not only that - it's the law. And it's the law for engineers as well. Calling oneself an "engineer" as distinct from a "professional engineer" to get around the licensing law is misleading to the public, who often cannot distinguish the difference. For an unlicensed person to sign a letter "Mechanical Engineer," for

example, is implying to the recipient that he/she is authorized by the Board to practice as a professional engineer in this state, whether it says "engineer" or "professional engineer."

As professional engineers, we should be proud to use the title. "Engineer" is not a general description, as was argued by a non-licensed person. It is a title you have earned and only you can claim it with "P.E." initials behind your name.

PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYING DIVISION LETTER

The purpose of the Board as summarized in the first paragraph of our Code of State Regulations (20 CSR 2030-1.010) "is to protect the inhabitants of this state in the enjoyment of life, health, peace and safety, and to protect their property from damage or destruction through dangerous, dishonest, incompetent or unlawful architectural, professional engineering, land surveying or landscape architectural practice and generally to conserve the public welfare." During the August Board meeting in Independence, we explored how to best achieve the tenants of that mission statement. Several of our design professionals felt that the Board should become more proactive and less reactive. Their primary concern is that public works and buildings are being built (particularly in out-state areas where no building codes exist) without proper planning. (The Board has seen instances of



structures capable of accommodating several hundred individuals being built without regard to emergency exits, fire resistance, or even structural analysis.) They reasoned that in order to best protect the general public, we should hire additional in-house investigators to actively search for infractions of RSMo 327. Rather than wait for such a situation to come to the attention of the Board in the form of a complaint (or reading about a structural failure in the newspaper after it's too late) why not go looking?

But the members of the Land Surveying Division had a certain amount of trouble imagining the application of this pro-active approach to the land surveying profession. Should we instruct investigators to drive around the state looking for survey markers, measure between them, or maybe give them a good kick to assure they were "firmly set?"

Maybe a better approach would be to be pro-active in promoting the concept of professionalism. By all ethical codes and standards, professional licensees must agree to police their own professions, and it seems much more efficient to have 950 surveyors throughout the state actively protecting the public against incompetent or unlawful surveying than a couple of investigators scuffing the toe of their shoe on every rebar they encounter.

This approach is based on the underlying principle that any profession must guarantee to the public the trustworthiness of its own practitioners. Said another way, our Code of Professional Conduct [20 CSR 2030-2.010(3)] requires that one "shall be cognizant that their primary obligation is to the public welfare"... This concept is considered so important that three paragraphs later [20 CSR 2030-2.010(6)] it's reiterated: "Licensees at all times shall recog-

nize that their primary obligation is to protect the safety, health, property or welfare of the public." Compare these regulations with the Board's mission statement. Seems like we're all in this together.

As a profession, the land surveying community is obviously best equipped to recognize inadequate or unlawful surveying work when they see it. Am I proposing to turn all surveyors into snitches and whistle-blowers. Not at all. While none of us would have any problem reporting unlicensed practice, it's usually a little harder to deal with a fellow licensee. So, what I am proposing is that each and every surveyor recognize that he/she is responsible for enhancing our status as professionals both among ourselves and to the general public. Only when it is thoroughly understood by the public and our peers that a certain quality of work (and nothing less) is expected, will we begin to adequately protect the public, and at the same time, achieve the next degree of professionalism. Only when the great majority of us agree to strive to be more professional, will those whose work is less than acceptable be forced to raise their own standards.

Of course, we probably all know of a licensed surveyor down the road who thrives on cheap prices and short-cut work. He's the guy who never researches the records because it takes too long, who never restores a section corner because it requires a corner document, who never records a survey because it would cost too much, who would rather yield to a fence corner than verify its correctness, and who doesn't show a controlling corner on his plat because it wouldn't fit anyway. Am I naive enough to believe that this guy is going to realize his work is incompetent and try to raise his standards? No, that's where your licensing Board

comes in. Sad but true, there are those unwilling to meet Minimum Standards until compelled to do so. If raising the bar in your area doesn't work, try a direct approach and have a frank talk with the miscreant. Maybe band together with other area surveyors from your professional society to approach him. And if that fails, in order to protect the general public, bring him to the attention of the Board.

When we recognize that each of us bears a responsibility to protect the public in matters pertaining to surveying, the public will in turn begin to perceive surveyors with the respect we deserve. If we're to meet our primary obligation, then each of us, whether as individual professionals, as members of professional societies, or as members of the Board, must be pro-active in promoting professionalism to better protect the public.

LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURAL DIVISION LETTER

The Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Boards (CLARB) held its Spring Meeting on February 24th, 25th, and 26th in St.



Louis. Representing Missouri were first time Board Staff attendees Judy Kempker (Executive Director) and Sandy Robinson (Administrative Assistant) along with Board Members Jerany Jackson and myself. In a format change from past spring meetings, the first day consisted of a series of continuing education

workshops that was open to the general public as well as CLARB Member Boards. The morning topics included Global Environmental Challenges and Urbanization and Accessibility Issues in Designing Outdoor Facilities. The afternoon session was a Forum on Licensure with a detailed discussion on how licensure impacts the public and the profession now and in the future. From all of the discussion, achieving national licensure was selected as the most important issue for CLARB to address in the future. The first day workshop was deemed a success by those in attendance, and will most likely be repeated in the future. There is some early indication that the 2007 CLARB Spring meeting next February may be held in Kansas City, so keep an eye on the CLARB calendar if you need continuing education credits or would like to learn more about CLARB.

The next two days followed the traditional format from past meetings. Member Boards received mid year reports from the Board of Directors, including a Treasure's Report from Frank Basciano, a review of the candidates for nomination to the Board of Directors by President Sandra Gonzalez, and an update from Jim Penrod regarding the Task Analysis and the changes to the L.A.R.E. as a result of the Task Analysis.

The remainder of the meeting was spent in regional meetings. Eight of the ten Member Boards from Region II were in attendance including Minnesota, Indiana, Iowa, Wisconsin, Illinois, Kentucky, Ohio, and Missouri. Among the topics discussed were continuing education, national nominations, disciplinary action and enforcement, L.A.R.E. changes and CLARB finances. Jerany Jackson continues to serve in a leadership role as the

newly elected CLARB Region II Director. She began her two year term at the Annual Meeting this past September. I will continue to serve as the Region II representative to the Nomination Committee.



Jerany and I also attended the CLARB Annual Meeting this past September in San Antonio. There was an opportunity for the public to attend a continuing education course followed with Member Boards workshops on the exam process, a disciplinary action database discussion, enforcement, national continuing education, and Member Board dues. In the General Sessions, Missouri voted for new CLARB officers including President Elect, Second Vice President, and Secretary, as well as four resolutions that will modify CLARB Bylaws primarily dealing with qualifications and nominations of national offices.

As you probably know, the Governor issued Executive Order 06-04 on February 1, 2006, that created the Department of Insurance, Financial

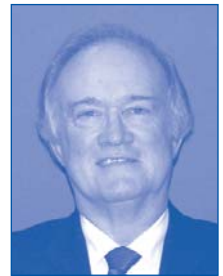

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING THE RENEWAL OF YOUR LICENSE

Please be advised that "Renewal Notices" have been mailed to all architects, engineers, land surveyors, landscape architects, architectural corporations, engineering corporations, land surveying corporations and landscape architectural corporations that were originally licensed in an **EVEN** year. If you were originally licensed in an even year and you have not received your renewal notice, please call the Board office at (573) 751-0047 as soon as possible.

- ⇒ Renewal notices are mailed as a courtesy to all licensees.
- ⇒ The renewal notice is mailed to your address of record on file at the Board office. If you move, it is your responsibility to notify the Board office of your new address promptly so that we can update your record.
- ⇒ The Board cannot be responsible for misplaced or mishandled mail.
- ⇒ Failure to receive an application for renewal of a license or certificate of authority does not relieve the licensee or certificate holder from their duty to timely renew, nor does it relieve them from the obligation to pay any additional fee(s) necessitated by any late renewal.

Before you return your renewal notice to the Board office, please check the following:

- ☐ Have you enclosed the correct fee?
- ☐ Have you completed all sections?
- ☐ Have you signed the renewal notice?

Renewal applications are not valid unless signed. **Renewal applications that are incomplete or submitted without the correct fee WILL BE RETURNED.**

It is the licensee's responsibility to ensure that the renewal form is completed and returned in a timely manner, even if you have delegated it to an office manager or assistant. The renewal period will end on December 31, 2006. A licensee who fails to renew his/her license by the renewal date shall not practice in Missouri. Licensees practicing in Missouri without a renewed license are subject to disciplinary action by the Board.

You also have the option of renewing your license online. In fact, the Board strongly encourages its licensees who are up for renewal in 2006 to utilize the online renewal system. By renewing online, you are provided with immediate confirmation that your license has been renewed. It also allows you to pay your renewal fee with a major credit card.

Please note that online renewals are not available for the following licensees*:

- Licensees wishing to change their license status from active to inactive.
- Licensees who currently hold an inactive license and wish to return to an active status.
- Licensees who currently hold an inactive license and wish to remain inactive.
- Licensees who will have reached the age of 75 or older.
- Renewal of a Corporate Certificate of Authority/Limited Liability Company.

**These licensees must complete and return the paper renewal form.*

If you are not sure when your license expires, you can either call the Board office, visit the Board's web site and click on "Licensee Search" or look at the 5 x 7 certificate sent the last time you renewed-----it will display your expiration date.

TEMPORARY FEE REDUCTION

We are extremely pleased to announce that pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2030-6.015 (1)(M) and the Board's resolution of August 14, 2006, the fee for the renewal of your professional license has temporarily been reduced to \$30.00. That is a savings of \$70.00! This temporary fee reduction will be in effect for those licensees renewing this year for the renewal period beginning January 1, 2007 and concluding December 31, 2008 as well as for those licensees renewing next year for the renewal period beginning January 1, 2008 and concluding December 31, 2009. Renewal fees have been temporarily reduced because the Board has been able to substantially reduce its expenses by finding more efficient and cost effective operating procedures. Although this reduction is temporary, the Board is contemplating a permanent reduction of the current \$100.00 rate should the current trend continue. CONTINUING EDUCATION AUDIT RESULTS

Below are the results of the random audit conducted by the Board of its professional engineering and land surveying licensees for the 2006-2007 renewal period:

Professional Engineer's Audit

- 17 licensees requested Inactive status;
- 5 licensees advised the Board that they did not wish to renew;
- 6 licensees were suspended for failure to respond;
- 2 licensees were suspended for not submitting additional information supporting their initial claim for PDHs; and,
- 1 licensee was reported as being deceased.

All other professional engineering licensees who had been selected for audit met the PDH requirements per Board Rule 20 CSR 2030-11.015.

Professional Land Surveyor's Audit

Out of the total professional land surveying licensees that were audited for the 2006-2007 renewal period, we are pleased to report that **ALL** licensees met the PDU requirements per Board Rule 20 CSR 2030-8.020.

NCEES Announces Registered Continuing Education Providers Program (Reprinted with NCEES' permission)

The National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) announces the creation of the Registered Continuing Education Providers Program (RCEPP). The new program will form a comprehensive registry of continuing education providers that have demonstrated adherence to high-quality, effective practices in professional education for engineers and surveyors. It is a joint effort between NCEES and the American Council of Engineering Companies.

The program began August 1, 2006, at which time, NCEES launched www.rcep.net, a comprehensive web site that will make it easier for engineers and surveyors to fulfill and track continuing professional competency (CPC) requirements.

Plan Submission to Missouri Division of Fire Safety - Elevator Equipment

State regulatory oversight of elevators and related equipment began in 1999 with the Missouri Division of Fire Safety-Office of the State Fire Marshal being the state agency assigned to administer the program. State statutes, RSMo 701.350 - 701.383, along with promulgated rules and regulations, provide specific requirements that address safety related issues with elevators and related equipment.

As outlined in RSMo 701.373, before the construction of any new elevator or related equipment is to be installed or any major alteration of an existing installation, a plan review shall be conducted. The plan review and other information necessary shall be submitted to the Division of Fire Safety to ensure compliance with state requirements as set forth.

It is the Division of Fire Safety's intent to begin the review process at the earliest point possible, before building construction begins, to identify potential non-compliant issues. Early review will avoid costly corrections for the contractor(s). To accomplish this, the Division of Fire Safety would like to make architects and engineers aware of the plan review submittal process and procedure.

The plans to be submitted to the Division of Fire Safety shall include the following as they pertain to the elevator or related equipment:

A plan review will be conducted and any non-compliant issues will be identified for the architect and engineer so that corrections can be made. All plans must be sealed by a Missouri licensed architect and engineer. After the review process, an installation or alteration permit application shall be submitted to the Division of Fire Safety along with appropriate plan review and permit fee.

The Division of Fire Safety believes this process would be of great benefit to the architects, engineers, general contractors, and elevator contractors if this procedure could begin as soon as possible.

NEWLY IMPOSED DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

REVOCATION

EARL F. MCKINNEY, E-17956
Lexington, Kentucky

Summary: Mr. McKinney submitted information on his renewal application that he had been subject to disciplinary action in the States of Texas, California, Kentucky and Vermont.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. McKinney violated Section 327.441.2(5), (6), (8) and (13), RSMo 2000 as follows: by making false representations to the California Board and to the Kentucky Board, which conduct constitutes incompetency, fraud, misconduct, misrepresentation and dishonesty in the performance of the duties of an engineer; by misrepresenting to the Kentucky Board about the number of states in which he was registered as an electrical engineer; by signing a boundary survey when he was not a licensed land surveyor and, for a two year period, Mr. McKinney signed electrical engineering plans when he was not licensed to do so, which conduct constitutes failing to act with reasonable care and competence; by being disciplined in other states is conduct that would be cause for discipline in the State of Missouri; and the above conduct would constitute the violation of Mr. McKinney's clients' and colleagues' professional trust.

Board Action: The Administrative Hearing Commission issued a Decision on December 21, 2005, concluding that Mr. McKinney is subject to discipline. Thereafter, the Board voted to revoke Mr. McKinney's professional engineering license effective May 25, 2006

AYKUT KARACA, E-19366
Crestwood, Missouri

Summary: Mr. Karaca was aware and permitted unlicensed employees of KBR Engineering, Inc. in the Belleville office to practice engineering in Missouri without having first been issued a certificate of authority to offer and/or render engineering services. Mr. Karaca also failed to supervise each step of the preparation of the engineering services completed by employees at the Belleville office and failed to give input to the employees at the Belleville office prior to the completion of the plans. Mr. Karaca failed to review the final completed engineering projects prepared by the Belleville employees as well as failed to review the project lists that were provided to him.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Karaca violated Section 327.441.2(5), (6) (10) and (13), RSMo 2000 as follows: by allowing an unlicensed person to affix his seal to Missouri projects that were not prepared by Mr. Karaca or under his immediate personal supervision; by assisting an unlicensed person in the unlawful practice of engineering; by not being in direct control and personally supervising all engineering done for KBR Engineering, Inc.; by failing to be in direct control and personally supervising the engineering activities of the Belleville office, Mr. Karaca failed to act with reasonable care and competence ordinarily applied by professional engineers; misconduct by Mr. Karaca's general lack of disposition to use his ability to supervise the engineering work of the Belleville office; and, violating professional trust and confidence by not fulfilling his professional duty to direct and control KBR Engineering, Inc.'s engineering activities.

Board Action: The Administrative Hearing Commission issued a Decision on November 24, 2004, concluding that Mr. Karaca is subject to discipline. Thereafter, the Board voted to revoke Mr. Karaca's professional engineering license effective March 4, 2005

RAY E. OBERKRAMER, LS-1206
EUREKA, MISSOURI

Summary: Mr. Oberkramer agreed to his professional land surveying license being placed on probation for a period of two years commencing on April 1, 2006 and ending March 31, 2008 for failing to file documentation with DNR required for the reestablishment and restoration of a corner which constitutes: 1) incompetency, misconduct, gross negligence, fraud, misrepresentation and dishonesty in the performance of the functions and duties of any profes-

sional licensed or regulated pursuant to Section 327.441.2(5), RSMo 2000; 2) by violating any provision of Chapter 327 or of any lawful rule or regulation adopted pursuant to Chapter 327.441.2(6); and 3) violating the professional trust and confidence Mr. Oberkramer owed to the Board and the public pursuant to Section 327.441.2(13), RSMo 2000. As a condition of Mr. Oberkramer's probation, he was required to provide to the Board within 30 days from the effective date of the Settlement Agreement written proof that he had filed with the Department of Natural Resources all appropriate documentation required for the reestablishment and restoration of a corner.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Oberkramer failed to file with the Department of Natural Resources all appropriate documentation required for the reestablishment and restoration of a corner.

Board Action: Because Mr. Oberkramer violated the terms and conditions of his Settlement Agreement, the Board held a violation hearing on August 14, 2006. The Board found that Mr. Oberkramer did violate the terms and conditions of his probation and voted to revoke Mr. Oberkramer's professional land surveying license effective August 16, 2006.

SUSPENSION

CHARLES ERIC ANDERSON, E-23080
St. Charles, Missouri

Summary: As previously reported in the Board's Fall 2005 Dimensions newsletter, Mr. Anderson agreed to his professional engineering license being placed on probation for a period of two years commencing on October 29, 2004 and ending October 28, 2006 for assisting and enabling an unlicensed person in the practice of engineering. As a condition of Mr. Anderson's probation, he was to submit written reports to the Board no later than January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1 of each year of the disciplinary period as well as provide the Board with a list of all engineering projects that he has worked on during the preceding three month term.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Anderson did not submit to the Board, written reports due by July 1, 2005, October 1, 2005 and January 1, 2006, as required in the Consent Agreement.

Board Action: Because of Mr. Anderson's violations of the terms of the Consent Agreement and Order, the Board held a violation hearing and found that Mr. Anderson did violate the terms of his probation and imposed additional discipline. The Board suspended Mr. Anderson's professional engineering license for a period of two years commencing on March 1, 2006 and ending on February 29, 2008 followed by probation for a period of two years commencing on March 1, 2008 and ending on February 28, 2010.

PROBATION

KBR ENGINEERING, INC., E-821-F
St. Louis, Missouri

Summary: Mr. Karaca, the owner of KBR Engineering, Inc., was aware and permitted unlicensed employees of KBR Engineering, Inc. in the Belleville office to practice engineering in Missouri without having first been issued a certificate of authority to offer and/or render engineering services. Mr. Karaca also failed to supervise each step of the preparation of the engineering services completed by employees at the Belleville office and failed to give input to the employees at the Belleville office prior to the completion of the plans. Mr. Karaca failed to review the final completed engineering projects prepared by the Belleville employees as well as failed to review the project lists that were provided to him.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Karaca violated Section 327.441.2(5), (6) (10) and (13), RSMo 2000 as follows: by allowing an unlicensed person to affix his seal to Missouri projects that were not prepared by Mr. Karaca or under his immediate personal supervision; by assisting an unlicensed person in the unlawful practice of engineering; by not being in direct control and personally supervising all engineering done for KBR Engineering, Inc.; by failing to be in direct control and personally supervising the engineering activities of the Belleville office, Mr. Karaca failed to act with reasonable care and competence ordinarily applied by professional engineers; misconduct by Mr.

Karaca's general lack of disposition to use his ability to supervise the engineering work of the Belleville office; and, violating professional trust and confidence by not fulfilling his professional duty to direct and control KBR Engineering, Inc.'s engineering activities.

Board Action: The Administrative Hearing Commission issued a Decision on November 24, 2004, concluding that KBR Engineering, Inc. is subject to discipline as a result of the violations of its owner. Thereafter, the Board voted to place KBR's Corporate Certificate of Authority for engineering services on probation for a period of three years commencing on March 4, 2005 and ending on March 3, 2008.

PUBLIC CENSURE

G. THOMAS WELCH, E-26959
Greenville, South Carolina

Summary: The Board received notification that Mr. Welch's professional engineering license was disciplined in the States of South Carolina, Oklahoma and Pennsylvania.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Welch violated Section 327.441.2(5), (6), (8) and (13), RSMo 2000, by: failing to comply with state laws in the States of South Carolina, Oklahoma and Pennsylvania, which is cause for discipline in the State of Missouri.

Board Action: The Administrative Hearing Commission issued a Consent Order on February 9, 2006, concluding that Mr. Welch is subject to discipline. By agreement of the parties, Mr. Welch's professional engineering license was publicly censured.

SURRENDER

JAMES O. JACKSON, E-14597
Camdenton, Missouri

Summary: As previously reported the Board's Summer 2004 Dimensions newsletter, Mr. Jackson agreed to his professional engineering license being suspended for a period of six (6) months followed by probation for a period of two years commencing on May 26, 2004 and ending May 25, 2006 for failing to act with reasonable care and competence in the preparation of the plans for the Twisted Oaks Subdivision water line extension, the Ronnie George waterline extension and the Westwood Estates Subdivision, all located in Camden County, Missouri and Lake Road 54-62 (Lazy Days Road) Phase II for the City of Osage Beach Special Road District, which constitutes a violation of Board Rule 20 CSR 2030-2.010(2) and Section 327.441.2(6), RSMo.; for failing to apply the technical knowledge and skill which are ordinarily applied by professional engineers of good standing practicing in Missouri in his preparation of Twisted Oaks, George Subdivision, Westwood Estates and Lazy Days Road, in violation of Board Rule 20 CSR 2030-2.010(2) and Section 327.441.2(6), RSMo.; failing to include a disclaimer on the Lazy Days Road plans clarifying his responsibility and to obtain the seal of a land surveyor, which constitutes a violation of 20 CSR 2030-3.030(5) and Section 327.441.2(6), RSMo; and for failing to practice engineering with reasonable care and competence and to apply the technical knowledge and skill which are ordinarily applied by professional engineers of good standing practicing in Missouri, which constitutes a violation of Section 327.441.2(13), RSMo, the professional trust and confidence Mr. Jackson owed to the clients of Jackson Engineering and the public. As a condition of Mr. Jackson's probation, he was to comply with all provisions of Chapter 327, RSMo, all rules and regulations of the Board and all federal and state laws, rules and regulations.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Jackson violated his terms and conditions of probation by failing to comply with all provisions of Chapter 327, RSMo and the Board Regulations.

Board Action: On June 5, 2006, Mr. Jackson voluntarily surrendered his professional engineering license.

INJUNCTIONS

MICHAEL CARR, NOT LICENSED Cassville, Missouri

Summary: A complaint was filed against Mr. Carr alleging the unlicensed practice of architecture and engineering.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Carr's conduct amounted to the unlicensed practice of architecture and engineering pursuant to Section 327.101 and 327.191, RSMo 2000.

Board Action: The Board authorized the Attorney General's Office to file a petition for injunction in the Circuit Court of Barry County, Missouri. On February 22, 2006, Judge Alan Blankenship issued an Order and Final Judgment for Permanent Injunction, in that Michael Carr is permanently enjoined and prohibited from offering to engage in any and all acts and practices for which a license as an architect or professional engineer is required in Missouri under Chapter 327, RSMo, or assisting or enabling another to do so on his behalf, until such time as Mr. Carr applies for and obtains a current and valid license to do so from the Board.

MORRIS LOWE, NOT LICENSED Cassville, Missouri

Summary: A complaint was filed against Mr. Lowe alleging the unlicensed practice of architecture and engineering.

Cause for Discipline: Mr. Lowe's conduct amounted to the unlicensed practice of architecture and engineering pursuant to Section 327.101 and 327.191, RSMo 2000.

Board Action: The Board authorized the Attorney General's Office to file a petition for injunction in the Circuit Court of Barry County, Missouri. On February 22, 2006, Judge Alan Blankenship issued an Order and Final Judgment for Permanent Injunction, in that Morris Lowe is permanently enjoined and prohibited from offering to engage in any and all acts and practices for which a license as an architect or professional engineer is required in Missouri under Chapter 327, RSMo, or assisting or enabling another to do so on his behalf, until such time as Mr. Lowe applies for and obtains a current and valid license to do so from the Board.

LEGISLATION

The Missouri Legislature brought the Second Regular Session of the 93rd General Assembly to a close on Friday, May 12th. There were four bills introduced that proposed significant changes to the Board's licensing law (Chapter 327, RSMo). Those four bills were House Bill 1758, Senate Bill 798, House Bill 1494 and Senate Bill 819. Unfortunately, House Bill 1758 and Senate Bill 798 **failed** to pass. These were identical bills which, if passed, would have authorized the Board to impose civil penalties. These bills were introduced by the professional associations but had the full support of the Board. The Board very much appreciated the time and attention given by the professional associations (AIA, MSPE, MSPS, MALA and ASLA) in an attempt to get one, or both, of these bills passed. Their efforts did not go unnoticed. A very special "THANKS" goes to Matt Kauffman who took the lead. Matt made a number of trips to the State Capitol for lobbying purposes and did an exceptional job in providing clear and concise testimony before the Legislature in support of these bills. It is the intent of the professional associations to re-introduce similar language in the 2007 Legislative Session.

On a brighter note, we are pleased to announce that House Bill 1494 and Senate Bill 819 were Truly Agreed To and Finally Passed in the 2006 Session of the Missouri General Assembly. These bills contained identical language which changed Missouri's eminence provisions of the law. The revisions include the removal of the requirements that professional land surveying and professional engineering applicants be at least 50 years of age and pass an oral examination. These requirements were subject to challenge as a relevant or accurate assessment.

Due to the passage of these bills, the following changes became effective August 28, 2006:

A professional land surveying license shall be issued to applicants, applying pursuant to the provisions of Section 327.391, who have twenty years of satisfactory land surveying experience and who pass the fundamentals of land surveying examination, the professional land surveying examination, and the Missouri state specific examination. (NOTE: The traditional methods of obtaining a professional land surveying license pursuant to Sections 327.314 & 327.381 remain unchanged.)

A professional engineering license shall be issued to applicants, applying pursuant to the provisions of Section 327.392, who hold a bachelor's degree or higher in engineering, have twenty years of satisfactory engineering experience, and who pass part two of the professional engineering examination, which is a nationally recognized written exam. Passing this examination should make obtaining licensure by comity (or reciprocity) much easier for these specific applicants. (NOTE: The traditional methods of obtaining a professional engineering license pursuant to Sections 327.221 & 327.381 remain unchanged.)

Another change allows the Board to waive the fundamentals exam and issue a professional engineering license to any individual who holds a degree from an ABET-accredited school or its equivalent and a doctorate in engineering from an institution that offers Engineering Accreditation Commission programs, has four years of satisfactory engineering experience and who passes part two of the written examination defined in Section 327.241. For the candidate to qualify, the Board must approve the doctorate degree. The goal of this change is to address the faculty licensure issue.

For your ease of reference, we have taken the liberty of publishing the revisions to Section 327.391 as well as the newly enacted language of Section 327.392, which read as follows:

327.391. The board shall upon application issue a license to any [engineer or professional land surveyor who is at least fifty years of age,] **individual** who has at least twenty years of satisfactory experience, and who passes [a written examination or holds a degree at the bachelor's level or higher in engineering or science and passes an oral examination,] **the Fundamentals of Land Surveying examination, the Professional Land Surveying examination, and the Missouri State Specific examination** provided that any such application is accompanied by the required fee.

327.392. 1. The board shall upon application issue a professional engineering license to any individual who holds a degree at the bachelor's level or higher in engineering and who has at least twenty years of satisfactory engineering experience, and who passes part two of the written examination defined in section 327.241, provided that any such application is accompanied by the required fee.

2. The board shall upon application issue a professional engineering license to any individual who holds a degree from an Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET, INC.) or its equivalent and a doctorate in engineering from an institution that offers Engineering Accreditation Commission programs, and who passes part two of the written examination defined in section 327.241, provided that any such application is accompanied by the required fee. The doctorate degree must be approved by the board for the candidate to qualify.

DEPARTMENTAL TRANSFER AND ITS EFFECT ON THE BOARD'S RULES

As mentioned in Division Director David Broeker's article, as a result of Executive Order 06-04, the Division of Professional Registration was transferred from the Department of Economic Development to a newly created department entitled the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration. Effective August 28, 2006, the following rules were transferred to the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration:

IN ADDITION

As a result of Executive Order 06-04, the Division of Professional Registration is transferring from the Department of Economic Development to the Department of Insurance,

CLARIFICATION OF BOARD RULE 20 CSR 2030-8.020 - PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYOR - PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT UNITS

Missouri surveyors are now required to keep up with changes to the *Missouri Minimum Standards for Property Boundary Surveys*. Effective January 1, 2006, an amendment to our continuing education rule (20 CSR 2030-8.020) requires a licensee to have completed a course in Minimum Standards before being eligible to renew his/her license. Since 1996, section one of the rule has required that "each licensed land surveyor, as a condition for renewal of his/her license, shall complete a minimum of twenty (20) professional development units (PDU) each two-year period immediately preceding renewal"... The new section requires that:

"(A) Of the required professional development units...a minimum of four (4)...shall be in Minimum Standards (20 CSR 2030, Chapters 16, 17 and 19) during the four (4)-year period immediately preceding renewal."

Since a law can't be retroactive, the licensing Board agreed that it would not require the four (4) professional development units in Minimum Standards as a condition for renewal until December 31, 2009, which is a full four (4) years from the effective date of January 1, 2006.

PROPOSED RULES

At the August 14, 2006 Board Meeting, the Board voted to promulgate a "Standard of Care" rule as well as a "Title Block" rule. These rules, if adopted, will affect the architectural, engineering and landscape architectural professions. A copy of the Proposed Rules is printed below and will later be published in the Missouri Register. The Board welcomes any comments you may have on these Proposed Rules.

20 CSR 2030-2.040 Standard of Care

PURPOSE: This rule provides the recipient and producer of professional architectural, engineering and/or landscape architectural services assurances that all services are evaluated in accordance with the 2006 edition of the International Building Code, Section 106.

The Board shall use, in the absence of any local building code, Section 106 only of the 2006 edition of the International Building Code, not including or applying any other sections referenced within Section 106, as the standard of care in determining the appropriate conduct for any professional licensed or regulated by this chapter and being evaluated under Section 327.441.2(5) RSMo.

20 CSR 2030-2.050 Title Block

PURPOSE: This rule clarifies the identity of the client and entity preparing and sealing all architectural, engineering and/or landscape architectural documents.

(1) An architectural, engineering or landscape architectural entity shall incorporate a title block on all drawings and other documents required to be signed and sealed by Chapter 327, RSMo and these regulations.

(2) A licensee may not remove a title block from any print or reproduction of the documents described in these regulations.

(3) The title block must, at a minimum, contain the following information:

- (A) The name of the entity either as a sole proprietor, partnership, corporation, limited liability company or other appropriate entity.
- (B) The entity address and phone number.
- (C) Name or identification of project.
- (D) Date prepared.
- (E) Space for the signature and dated seal.
- (F) The printed name, discipline and license number of the person sealing the document.

RULE UPDATE

A number of rule changes went into effect on June 30, 2006. The rules were amended primarily for housecleaning purposes. The affected rules are as follows:

20 CSR 2030-1.020 - Board Compensation - This rule was amended to reflect the correct name of the Board as shown in the "HEADING," "PURPOSE" and "TEXT," and to delete paragraph (1). Since there are no members serving on the Board whose term of office began before October 11, 1986, this paragraph is no longer necessary.

20 CSR 2030-2.010 - Code of Professional Conduct - The "HEADING," "PURPOSE" and/or "TEXT" of this rule was amended to reflect the correct name of the Board, to make reference to landscape architects, to add the word "professional" in front of land surveyor(s), and to change the words "registered," "registrant" and "registration" to "licensed," "licensee" and "licensure."

20 CSR 2030-4.050 - Criteria to File Application under 327.291, RSMo - The "PURPOSE" and "TEXT" of this rule was amended to comply with Chapter 327, RSMo by changing the words "registration" and "registered" to "licensure" and "licensed." It was further being amended to add the word "professional" in front of land surveyor(s) and to change the acronym "NCEE" to "NCEES."

20 CSR 2030-5.020 - NCARB Examinations - Architects - This rule was amended to reflect the correct name of the Board.

20 CSR 2030-5.070 - NCEES Examinations - Engineers - The "TITLE," "PURPOSE" and/or "TEXT" of this rule was amended to reflect the correct name of the Board and the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying. It was further amended to change the acronym "NCEE" to "NCEES."

20 CSR 2030-6.020 - Reexamination Fees - The "PURPOSE" of this rule was amended to delete the word "architects" and to add the word "professional" in front of land surveyors. The "TEXT" of this rule was amended to delete the reexamination fee for Landscape Architects as referenced in subparagraph (F); and, to delete the word "Land" from subparagraphs (D) and (E) to reflect the correct names of the examinations since the names of these examinations changed in April of 2005.

20 CSR 2030-7.010 - Nonresidents - The "HEADING," "PURPOSE" and/or "TEXT" of this rule was amended to reflect the correct name of the Board, to make reference to landscape architects, to add the word "professional" in front of land surveyor, and to change the words "registered" and "registration" to "licensed" and "licensure."

20 CSR 2030-11.010 - Renewal Period - The "PURPOSE" of this rule was amended to reflect the correct name of the Board. The "TEXT" of this rule was amended to delete reference to the licenses scheduled for renewal in December 2002 since that date has already expired.

20 CSR 2030-13.010 - Immediate Personal Supervision - The "PURPOSE" section of this rule was amended to include landscape architects and subparagraph (C) was amended to add an "s" to the words "specification" and "drawing." The "TEXT" of the rule was amended to delete the word "plans" and in subparagraph (D) the word "plan" is being replaced with the word "drawing."

20 CSR 2030-13.020 - Immediate Personal Supervision for Land Surveyors - This rule was amended to add the word "professional" before land surveyor(s) in the "TITLE," "PURPOSE" and "TEXT." It was further amended to correct a typo in paragraph (1)(A) and to change the word "registered" to "licensed."

20 CSR 2030-14.020 - Definition of Baccalaureate Degree From Approved Curriculum as Used in Section 327.312.1(1), RSMo - This rule was amended to reflect the correct name of the Board.

NCEES TO ADD CONSTRUCTION MODULE TO CIVIL PE EXAM (Reprinted with NCEES' Permission)

The Board of Directors of the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) recently approved new specifications for the Civil Principles and Practice of Engineering (PE) exam. The specifications include new content areas focused on construction engineering.

The Civil PE exam is a breadth and depth examination. All examinees work the same breadth portion in the morning and then choose one depth module to work in the afternoon. The topic areas of the current depth modules are environmental, geotechnical, structural, transportation, and water resources. Beginning with the spring 2008 exam administration, the exam will include a construction engineering depth module.

The Council has been discussing and researching the possibility of a construction depth module in the Civil PE exam for more than five years. The discussion began when the Construction Engineering Education Committee within the American Society of Civil Engineers' Construction Institute approached NCEES about the growing need to recognize construction engineering in the professional engineering licensure process.

In 2001, the Council voted to include construction issues in its study to update Civil PE exam content. As a part of this study, NCEES surveyed more than 10,000 licensed civil engineers to determine the knowledge areas needed to practice. The survey group represented various fields and geographic locations and included more than 1,600 construction engineers. Survey responses confirmed the need for a construction module.

"The field of construction engineering is large enough to justify the new exam module," says David Johnston, Ph.D., P.E., chair of the Construction Engineering Education Committee and a professor at North Carolina State University. "And it's appropriate for it to be one of the choices in the Civil PE exam because at least a quarter of graduating civil engineering students choose careers in construction. In addition, there are a growing number of ABET-accredited construction engineering degree programs producing construction engineers."

Many codes, specifications, and regulations now

require a licensed professional engineer to design various production and safety systems used to execute the construction process, and it is becoming more common for construction engineers to coordinate other licensed design professionals in design-build projects. NCEES has responded to issues related to the design-build construction process by creating a position statement to recognize the need for licensed professional engineers to be in responsible charge of all engineering services included in design-build projects.

The NCEES Construction Engineering Exam Subcommittee is currently creating questions for the new depth module based on the new specifications. The subcommittee, also chaired by Johnston, is made up of 27 licensed construction engineers working with the Civil PE exam committee. More detailed information about the specifications and content areas of the exam will be published after the fall 2007 exam administration.

The National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying develops licensing examinations for the engineering and surveying professions. These examinations are used by engineering and surveying licensing boards across the United States as part of their candidate assessment process. NCEES also

provides examination scoring and administration services to licensing boards, as well as a variety of other products and services to engineering and surveying professionals. NCEES headquarters is located in Clemson, S.C.

L.A.R.E. Examination Dates

The next exam "graphic" administration of the L.A.R.E. (Sections C and E) is December 4-5, 2006.

The Regular Registration Deadline is October 12, 2006.

The Late Registration Deadline is November 3, 2006 - Exams ordered after the regular registration deadline will be subject to a \$100 late fee per section.

The Cancellation Deadline is October 12, 2006 - This is the last day to cancel your examination with a partial refund in accordance with the Cancellation Policy.

- Section D - March 14 & 15, 2007

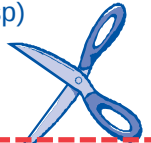
