Comments from the Chair (Continued)

Regarding the survey question in the last newsletter: "Should there be a Continuing Education requirement for Geologist re-registration?" We received responses from 33 of approximately 772 Registered Geologists in Missouri. That is better than a 4% response rate, not bad, given that respondents were required to mail or fax the survey forms back to the Board. As I have noted over the years geologists tend to be a rather vocal group whether providing comments about the registration examinations or surveys. When offered the opportunity to provide additional comment geologists often do so. This bears out in the survey results as follows:

9 responded NO, without comment.

17 responded NO, with comment.

7 responded YES, all with comments

The NO comments ranged from statements such as 'bad idea' to very well articulated discussions noting that geologists are professionals and do as a matter of professionalism stay current with the science in their area of expertise. Other comments weighed heavily on the diversity of the various activities that geologists are involved in and noted that providing Board Approved continuing education for such a broad spectrum of knowledge would be nearly impossible. Other reasons for opposition cited increased bureaucratic burden and that as a matter of other certifications or simply as part of the work place environment they already receive continuing education on an ongoing basis.

So with such an over resounding NO response, why does the Board keep the subject of continuing education on the table? Because some of the Board members believe the issue is of merit requiring additional examination and discussion.

The YES respondents to continuing education provide insight and equally compelling reasons for a continuing education requirement. It was noted that professionalism of the licensed members of the profession can be demonstrated by a requirement of continuing education and should be an important aspect of professional licensure. It has been noted that for those licensees that no longer or rarely practice geology a continuing education requirement provides, at least, a minimum standard for currency in the profession. Others cited the states of Texas and South Carolina as examples of model continuing education programs.

In conclusion, whatever the course the Board decides to take at this current juncture regarding continuing education I would like to express our hardy THANK YOU for all of your input, insights and recommendations. This has been beneficial.

2005 ASBOG Task Analysis Study (TAS)

The content or subject matter tested on licensing examinations is often determined through formal research studies. Several terms describe these studies, including task analysis, job analysis and role delineation. A major objective of these studies is to identify the tasks/activities performed by a profession and the knowledge necessary to perform these tasks. The task analysis results are used to create test blueprints (specifications, content outlines) that isolate those professional activities that impact public protection. The test blueprints determine the content of the examinations until there is a need to update the research to keep abreast of advances made in the profession.

ASBOG conducted the present study to update the content and scope of the Fundamentals of Geology (FG) and the practice of Geology (PG) Examinations. The present task analysis study builds on earlier task analysis studies completed in 1995 and 2000.

The 2005 TAS Committee conducted three meetings which included:

New Orleans, Louisiana - January 16 & 17, 2004
Columbia, South Carolina - April 1, 2004
Boise, Idaho - November 2, 2004

During these meetings, the 2005 TAS members (serving as Subject Matter Experts) accomplished several major objectives which included:

- 1) Reviewed the task statements from the Task Analysis completed in 2000
- 2) Developed and refined Task Analysis 2005 task statements to reflect advances within the geological profession
- 3) Constructed the Task Analysis 2005 Questionnaire
- 4) Reviewed the Task Analysis 2005 Questionnaire results to define the content of the FG and PG Examinations

A total of 7,270 questionnaires were mailed (with USA total=5,600 and Canada total=1,670). In addition, 500 questionnaires were mailed to randomly selected academicians from the American Geological Institute Directory. Approximately 50% of the questionnaires were completed and returned in the USA and approximately 41% were completed and returned from Canada. 18% of the academia questionnaires were completed and returned. The high return rates increase the likelihood that the respondents represent professional geologists and geoscientists across the USA and Canada.

The Task Analysis 2005 Questionnaire contained two rating scales, importance and time spent, regarding Task Statements.

Top 10 Highest Ratings for USA (Importance Scale) as contained on the Task Analysis 2005 Questionnaire were:

- 1) Manage, protect, or remediate soils, surface water or groundwater resources
- 2) Plan and conduct hydrogeological, geochemical and environmental investigations
- 3) Prepare and interpret logs, cross-sections, maps, and other graphics from field investigations
- 4) Plan and conduct field operations including human and ecological health, safety and regulatory considerations
- 5) Select, construct and interpret maps, cross-sections, and other data for field investigations
- 6) Design groundwater monitoring, observation, extraction, production, or injection wells
- 7) Characterize water quality and evaluate chemical fate and transport
- 8) Define and characterize saturated and vadose zone flow systems
- 9) Characterize and determine hydraulic properties
- 10) Develop and utilize Quality Assurance/Quality Control (QA/QC) procedures

Based on the results of the questionnaire, the TAS workshop developed the FG and PG Test Blueprints. To determine the relative weight and therefore the number of questions necessary for each task in the examinations, the following formula was used:

Task Weight = Time Spent x (importance Mean) Squared

RECENT BOARD ACTIVITIES

February 17-18, 2005

- Approved 17 (seventeen) individuals for RG licensure
- Approved 1 (one) individual for GRIT licensure
- Conducted 1 (one) educational review
- Discussed the use of Geologist versus Registered Geologist as legal/official title.
 - The Board issued the decision that statute 256.456.3 prohibits anyone not registered by the board from using the designation of "registered geologist". According to statute 256.456 no one shall engage in the practice of geology affecting public health, safety, and welfare unless the work is performed by or under the supervision of a "registered geologist".
- Discussed the survey for licensees to complete in order to gain input from them regarding the development of a CEU requirement for Registered Geologists. The results of the survey will be reviewed at the June 1, 2005 meeting.
- Discussed the development of a Missouri specific reciprocity examination to be administered to individuals who are licensed in another state but wish to obtain licensure in Missouri by reciprocity.
- Initiated a strategic plan for this coming year and future years as well. Goals and objectives were identified.
- Discussed what the Registered Geologists renewal fees are applied to:
 - A. Rent for central office space and warehouse space rent
 - B. Computer equipment and support services
 - C. CRR staff for time spent processing renewals, incoming fees received and incoming mail received
 - D. Percentage of fees received goes to Department of Economic Development administrative services as well as the State Office of Administration for services provided to Board.
 - E. Attorney services provided by the Attorney General's Office.
 - F. Office supplies and equipment.
 - G. Salaries for office staff
 - H. PerDiem and expenses for board members.

The Geology board spends approximately \$77,500.00 to \$78,000.00 annually in expenses and receives approximately \$94,000.00 in revenue annually.

At their meeting Wednesday, June 1, 2005 at the Division of Professional Registration, Jefferson City, Missouri, via conference call, the board accomplished the following:

- Approved 10 (ten) individuals for RG licensure.
- Discussed the possibility of geologists being able to use an electronic version of a signature and seal and will research the possibility of creating rule allowing the use of electronic signature and seal.
- Reviewed the upcoming ASBOG, CLEAR, and CAC conferences and members noted which ones they would like to attend.
- Reviewed the ASBOG financial report, 2004 records and the 2004 annual meeting minutes
- Continued the discussion and fact finding regarding continuing education requirements.
- Staff updated the board on the status of the Fee rule and Reciprocity rule.
- Discussed the implementation of a reciprocity exam and decided to table this item.
- Reviewed the strategic planning objectives developed at the February 18, 2005 meeting and noted accomplishments of many of said objectives.

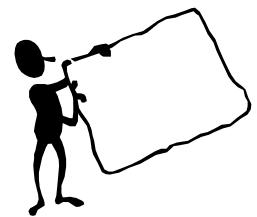
ADDRESS CHANGE - All licensees are required to notify the Board of Geologist Registration within 60 days of an address change. The notification can be submitted in writing to the State Board of Geologist Registration, P.O. Box 1335, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, by fax to (573) 526-0661 or by telephone to (573) 526-7625.

DUPLICATE LICENSE - Licensees can be issued a duplicate annual renewal license by submitting a completed Application for Duplicate Registration Certificate to State Board of Geologist Registration, P.O. Box 1335, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102 or by fax to (573) 526-0661.

WALL-HANGING LICENSE - Licensees can request a duplicate wall-hanging license by submitting a written request for a duplicate wall-hanging license to the Board of Geologist Registration, P.O. Box 1335, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. A \$15.00 fee made payable to the State Board of Geologist Registration must accompany the letter.

LICENSURE VERIFICATION TO ANOTHER STATE - Licensees must submit the required verification/certification form from the state in which licensure is being requested along with the required \$10.00 fee to the State Board of Geologist Registration, P.O. Box 1335, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.

RENEWALS - Renewals are mailed to all current licensees on or around February 1 of each year. Renewals are mailed to the most current address on file with the Board of Geologist Registration. The renewal license is valid for 1 year, May 1 to April 30. Effective with the renewal application to be mailed February 1st, 2006, the renewal period will change to a two(2) year license.

This formula places more weight on the Importance Scale compared with the Time Spent Scale and is a widely accepted procedure for licensure and certification task analyses.

The Task Analysis 2005 results will be implemented with the FG and PG Examinations in October 2005. The FG Examination will be structured around academic knowledge, will contain 130 items, and be administered in four hours. The PG Examination will concentrate on the practical application of geological principles. It will consist of 100 items and be administered over four hours.

ASBOG has conducted task analysis research studies in 1995, 2000 and 2005. The results of the three studies indicate that the practice of geology is exceptionally consistent throughout the USA. This determination provides a sound basis for developing examinations that are fair to candidates from all regions of the country.
