A new licensee that becomes licensed within 6 months or less of the renewal period, does the board staff advance their expiration date? Per discussion among members of the board, since the board does not have the ability to prorate license fees for new licensees, the board took the position to allow new licensee a grace period beginning July 1 prior to the renewal date.
